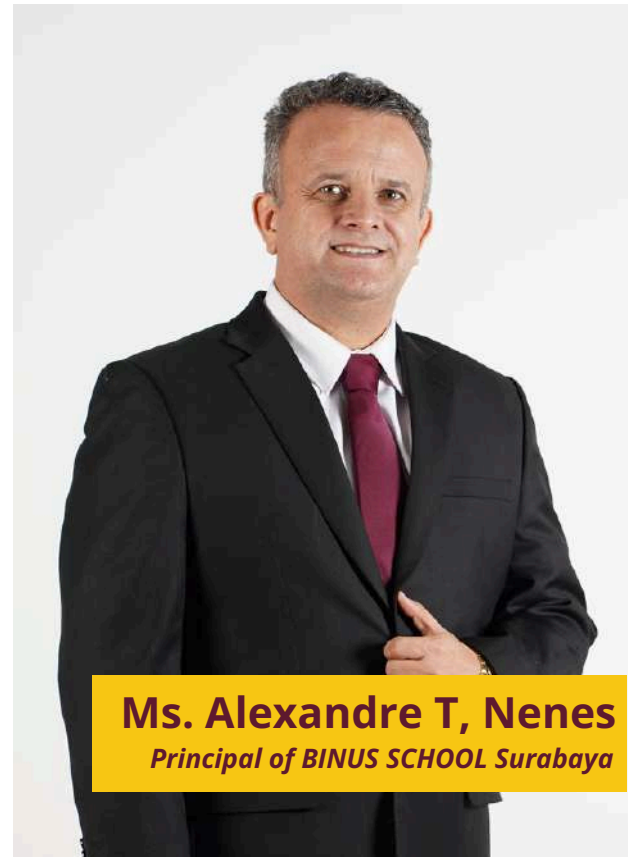

Innovation in Emergency Food Solutions: Silver Medal Achievement at NASPO



Our Binusian Grade 7 students (Haven, Sophia, Caylee, and Clarissa) **proudly won Silver Medals** at the National Science Applied Project Olympiad (NASPO) through an innovative project on alternative food sources during disaster situations.

Using a root plant from the cattail plant found around the school area, students discovered that it contains high levels of glucose, making it a potential emergency food source. This hands-on project strengthened their scientific inquiry, critical thinking, and environmental awareness.

Congratulations to our students for their impressive achievement. May this success inspire them to continue creating meaningful solutions for real-world challenges!

Learning Through Innovation: Silver Medal Achievement at NASPO

Our Grade 7 students (Wangseya, Kevin, Eldric and Keenan) proudly won Silver Medals at the National Science Applied Project Olympiad (NASPO) through a collaborative Science and Design Technology project on separating trash according to its material.

Using LEGO Spike, students designed and programmed a prototype equipped with a colour sensor to function as a material separator. This hands-on learning experience strengthened their understanding of science, coding, engineering, and problem-solving, while also fostering teamwork, creativity, and environmental awareness.

Strengthens Human-Centered Learning Through the BINUS Educators Conference 2026



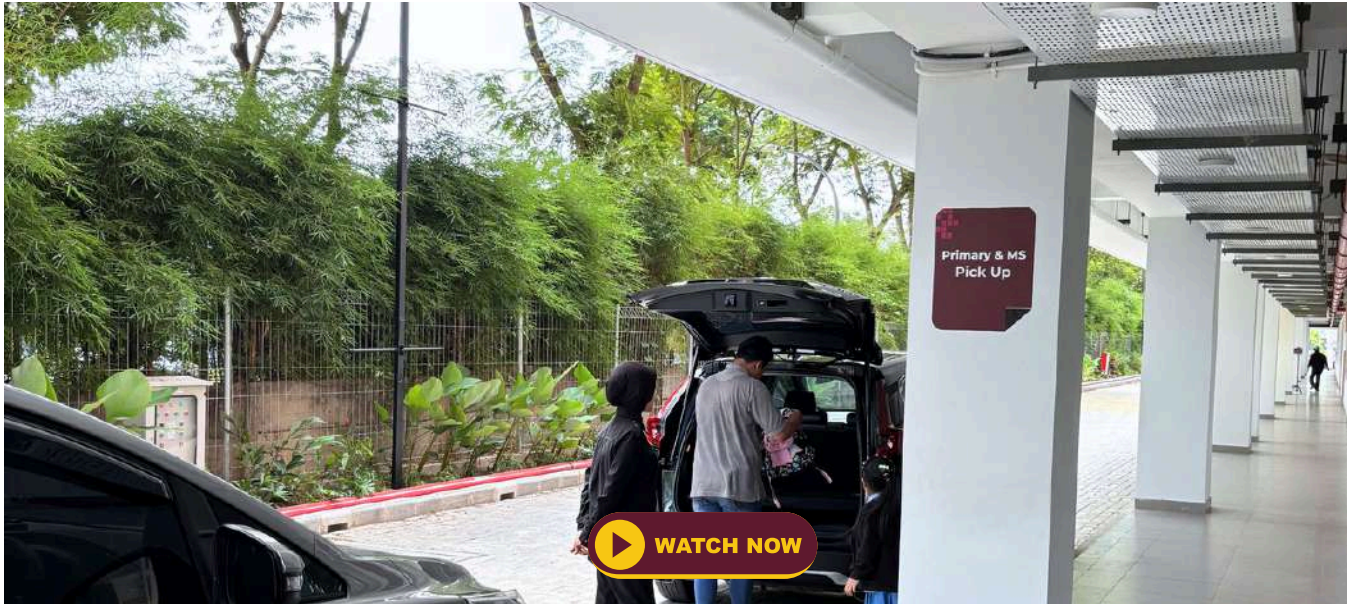

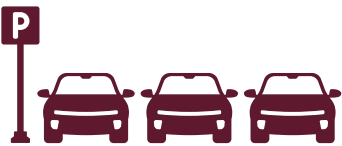

Learning Beyond the Classroom: Grade 7 Field Trip to Surabaya Zoo



As part of an interdisciplinary learning experience, our Grade 7 students participated in an educational field trip to Surabaya Zoo, integrating Science, Global Perspectives, and Art. This enriching journey provided students with meaningful opportunities to explore real-world contexts and deepen their understanding beyond the classroom.

From a Science perspective, students observed a wide variety of animals to develop their understanding of the characteristics of living things and how organisms are classified. Through direct observation, they also gained insights into the importance of ex-situ conservation, learning how conservation efforts help protect and preserve animal life.

Through Global Perspectives, students explored the drivers and impacts of human and animal migration within urban environments. They examined how urban development affects natural habitats and discussed sustainable solutions that balance societal growth with ecosystem preservation, encouraging them to become thoughtful and responsible global citizens.

In Art, students expressed their learning through visual storytelling techniques, using characters, panels, and sequencing to communicate environmental issues, particularly animal habitat loss caused by human activities. This creative process allowed students to reflect on their observations while developing artistic expression and critical thinking skills.

Overall, this field trip offered a holistic learning experience that nurtured students' curiosity, empathy, creativity, and awareness of environmental responsibility. We are proud to see our Grade 7 students actively engaged in meaningful learning and look forward to more experiences that support their growth as future-ready learners.

From the Earth to the Universe: A Meaningful Learning Journey

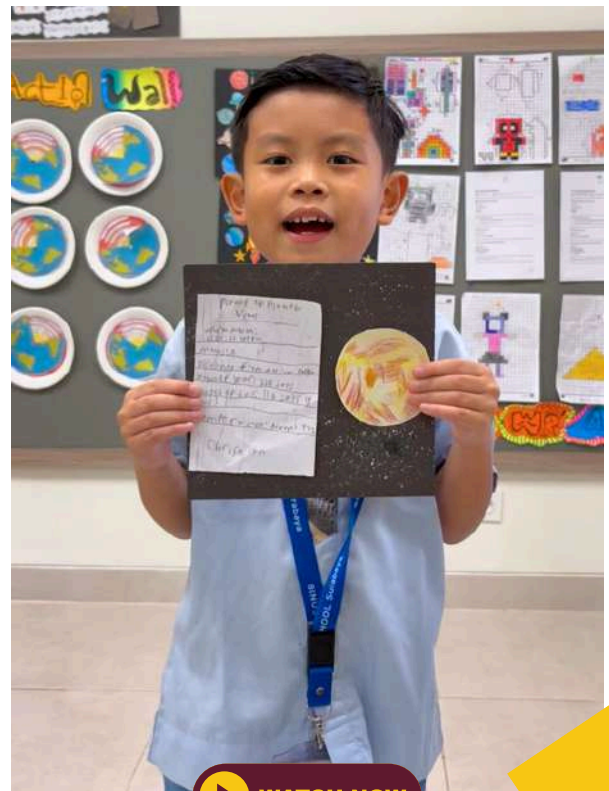
Learning becomes more meaningful when children can explore ideas in a fun and hands-on way. In this unit, Grade 2 students began their learning journey by discovering the Earth before expanding their understanding to the wider universe.

Students first learned about the layers of the Earth by creating clay models of the crust, mantle, outer core, and inner core. This activity helped them understand what the Earth is made of and how it can change over time. By using their hands to shape and build, children were able to turn abstract ideas into something they could clearly see and understand.

Building on this knowledge, students then explored the solar system.

They learned that the Earth is one of many planets and began identifying different planets, noticing similarities and differences between them. These activities encouraged curiosity and helped students see how our planet fits into a much bigger picture.

Through this connected learning experience, students developed a deeper understanding of the world around them while building confidence, curiosity, and a love for discovery. By starting with the Earth and moving outward to the universe, children were able to make meaningful connections that support their growth as thoughtful and enthusiastic learners.

Early Years Programme

Math Comes Alive in EY2: Learning to Count Through Our Senses

In Early Years 2, students are learning to count and connect numbers 11–20 with the quantities they represent through fun, meaningful, and hands-on experiences. By engaging their senses, touching, observing, listening, and exploring, students gain a deeper understanding of numbers while enjoying the learning process.

In the classroom, children use a variety of concrete materials such as blocks, toys, and everyday objects to practise counting. This sensory-based approach helps students visualise numbers, build number sense, and strengthen their confidence in early numeracy skills. Learning becomes more engaging when children can see, touch, and interact directly with what they are counting.



Through these activities, students are not only developing their mathematical understanding, but also improving their focus, fine motor skills, problem-solving abilities, and independence. Most importantly, they are learning that counting can be fun, meaningful, and part of their everyday experiences.

We are proud to see our EY 2 students actively involved, curious, and excited as they explore numbers through play, discovery, and hands-on learning.

Early Years and Primary at a Glance

BINUS SCHOOL Surabaya is a candidate school for the International Baccalaureate (IB) Primary Years Programme (PYP) and is working towards authorization. We would like to share with you the following important information about the PYP implementation at our school.

What is the PYP?

The PYP is an inquiry-based, concept-driven curriculum. It is one of the four programmes offered by the International Baccalaureate, a non-profit organization based in Geneva, Switzerland.

Which grade levels are engaged in the PYP?

At BINUS SCHOOL Surabaya, our early years and primary classes are engaged in the PYP. As part of the programme, our students are explicitly taught the IB learner profile, approaches to learning, and concepts. They explore units of inquiry grouped under six transdisciplinary themes, which have local and global significance.

What are the attributes of the IB learner profile?

We have 10 attributes of the IB learner profile.

The attributes include thinker, risk-taker, inquirer, communicator, knowledgeable, caring, reflective, open-minded, principled, and balanced.

We use the mnemonic, TRICK CROP B, to easily remember the IB learner profile attributes.

What are the approaches to learning?

The approaches to learning (ATL) are life skills, and they include communication skills, research skills, self-management, social skills, and thinking skills.

The ATL with the sub-skills are linked to the IB learner profile. Both the ATL and IB learner profile are embedded in our curriculum.

What languages are taught in the PYP?

At BINUS SCHOOL Surabaya, English is used as the language of instruction. Bahasa Indonesia is taught as the host country language. Mandarin is offered as an additional language, starting from early years 1.

How are PYP students assessed?

Students in the early years and primary are assessed using different strategies and tools, which include rubrics and checklists. Examples of our assessment strategies are performance assessments, open-ended tasks, and observations. Students maintain portfolios, which can be accessed from Toddle. We report student learning through written reports and various types of conferences such as Parent-Teacher Conference and Student-led Conference.
