

Middle School Programme

Seeing the World Through Different Lenses: Grade 7's Interdisciplinary Comic Project



Our Grade 7 students recently took part in an interdisciplinary project that combined Science, Global Perspectives (GLP), and Art. In groups of three, students were challenged to **create a comic story** about animal extinction or ecosystem disruption. What made this task unique was the requirement to present the story from three different perspectives: an animal, a businessman, and a conservationist. Through this activity, students learned that environmental issues can be viewed differently depending on one's role and interests.

To make the experience even more meaningful, Grade 7 students also presented their comics to younger students. This helped them practice explaining their ideas clearly while encouraging younger learners to start thinking about environmental responsibility.

Through this project, students not only developed their creativity and collaboration skills, but also gained a better understanding of the importance of seeing problems from different perspectives and finding balanced solutions.




Primary Programme

Discovering Communication Beyond Words

How do we communicate if we cannot use our voice? This meaningful question became the starting point of learning for our Primary 3 students as they explored their Unit of Inquiry, How We Express Ourselves.

During lessons, students are introduced to simple signs and symbols, practicing how to express words and short phrases using hand movements, gestures, and facial expressions. They quickly realised that communication is not just about speaking, it is also about observing carefully, expressing clearly, and understanding others.




Through this experience, students are learning why communication matters and how it can be adapted. They are beginning to understand that some people communicate differently, and that being able to express ourselves in various ways helps create a more inclusive and respectful community.

Beyond learning new signs, this unit also strengthens important skills. Students build confidence as they practice in front of their peers, develop focus as they pay attention to hand movements and expressions, and grow in empathy as they consider different ways people experience the world.

Early Years Programme

Early Years 2 Students Discover “How the World Works” Through Sensory Exploration



As part of their Unit of Inquiry How the World Works, our Early Years 2 students explored how their **five senses help them understand the world around them**. Instead of only learning inside the classroom, they experienced it firsthand observing what they could see, hear, touch, and smell in their environment.

During the trip, students identified living and non-living things and discussed their differences. They recorded their discoveries through drawings and simple descriptions, noticing colours, shapes, sizes, and textures. These hands-on activities strengthened their observation skills and encouraged them to express their ideas with confidence.

The experience also opened up meaningful conversations about how we use and care for our senses every day. Students reflected on why our senses are important and how people may experience the world differently. Through these discussions, they began developing both understanding and empathy in age-appropriate ways.



More than anything, this field trip showed that learning becomes more powerful when children can see and experience concepts in real life. It was a joyful day of curiosity, exploration, and meaningful connections, a reminder that some of the best learning happens beyond the classroom walls.


